## **SOU Covid-19 Guidelines**

### **Travel Team Responsibilities**

**Day of departure:** Each visiting team's travel party MUST be screened by a certified COVID-Screener. The visiting team's ATC will send SOU's athletic training staff confirmation that the party was screened AND a pre-filled (names only) Traveling Team Clearance Verification Form (see below). ALL members of the travel party should be included in this form. Information should be sent to Athletic Trainer Mark Ulbricht (ulbrichtm@sou.edu)

**Practice or non-competition day:** visiting teams are required to complete a Clearance Verification Form (CVF) and send a digital copy to the host ATCs each day of the trip. Screening should be conducted by a certified COVID-Screener and can include coaches on these days

**Competition day:** all visitors will be screened within 6 hours of competition. Screening will be conducted by the SOU athletic training staff using CVFs received in advance by the visiting team's ATC. Exceptions will be made to teams traveling with their own athletic trainer. Coaches cannot conduct screening on game day.

**Screening Time:** The visiting team will be screened an hour and a half prior to gametime. Visiting team screening will take place on the visiting team's bus.

*HIGH RISK:* Any screening scores of 3 or more will be immediately removed from competition

*MEDIUM RISK:* Refer to healthcare professional for further evaluation

## **Soccer Sport Specific Protocol Changes**

- Officials and coaches shall use social distancing/face coverings during the pregame meeting
- All Game Balls and Warm-Up Balls should be sanitized before the 90-minute mark before warmups. Game balls should be sanitized again at halftime at a minimum.
- Face coverings required entirety of warmups
- In Oregon, players/coaches/officials are required to wear face coverings.

### **Team Roster Limits**

County and/or State venue capacity guidelines will be followed. In the event that an area has a 75-person capacity limit.

### **Spectators**

Current CCC and SOU policies spectators will not be permitted.

### **Officials**

All CCC officials will be required to be screened by the host institution prior to the game on gameday. This is being done for protection of both the official and the participant. Officials must work with their assigner if they have not been feeling well prior to game day so adjustments can be made in assignments. Additionally, officials must follow the protocols specific to the sport they are working.

1. Recommended, when possible, drive separately to all game sites.
2. Officials will arrive at all games dressed in their uniform.

3. Officials required to take part in mandatory COVID-19 screening by home team
4. Officials will wear face coverings to and from venue and during contest
5. Officials will furnish their own water and water bottles.
6. Officials will furnish their own towels for(perspiration/showering\*). \*If location provides
7. Officials can use "whistle bag"
8. Officials will practice social distancing with face covering during captains meeting
9. Officials will practice "social distancing" during all live game situations
10. Officials will not engage in handshakes, fist pumps, and elbow contact with one another, players or coaches.
11. Officials will practice social distancing during all clock stoppage situations
12. Officials will maintain social distancing during any stoppage in action and after water break face covering must be reattached prior to starting contest
13. When speaking with a coach, captain or table crew social distancing should be maintained

### Directions

Raider Stadium is located near the corner of Iowa and Wightman Streets. Parking is available FREE on gamedays in the SOU lots near the stadium and on the neighboring streets. Please do not take up spots in the parking lots with buses.

### Bus/Van Parking

Buses and Vans should park along Wightman Street, below the tennis courts. There is no bus parking in any SOU parking lots and there is no room for buses in SOU Parking Lots.

### Team Arrival

Gates to Raider Stadium will be open an hour and a half prior to game time. Buses and Vans should drop off and park along Wightman Street to the West of Raider Stadium, below the tennis courts. Teams will be using the North entrance to Raider Stadium and the visiting team

will be in the North team/bench area. Restrooms/Locker Rooms and Training Room are located inside Raider Stadium.

**Athletic Training**

Athletic trainer Mark Ulbricht will be at Raider Stadium by 5 p.m. and will do the gameday screening for the visitors and officials at 6 p.m. at the North gate.

**Team Roster Limits**

**Masks**

Masks must be worn by all players/officials on the field and all coaches/participants in the team area where social distancing cannot happen.
